Parks User Survey Report 2024

Yardstick

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Executive Summary

This report has been prepared for the Parks and Wildlife Service of the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, and reports the results of a visitor survey carried out at parks and reserves around/bordering the Swan and Canning Riverpark to measure the level of visitor satisfaction. This is a requirement for the departmental Budget Statements as an Outcome and Key Effectiveness Indicator, with a target of 85% average satisfaction.

The survey was completed in November and December 2024 and is referred to in this report as the 2024 survey to distinguish it from surveys completed in previous years.

The 2024 survey was undertaken by Xyst Limited and uses the Yardstick user survey platform. This allows direct comparison with other organisations in Australia, New Zealand and Canada. The survey can be repeated regularly to allow trend analysis. The 2024 survey was started on 23 November 2024 and completed on 23 December 2024. School holidays in WA started on 13 December 2023, about two thirds through the survey period. Previous surveys have not established any correlation between holiday periods and survey results.

The survey collected information from 350 respondents about patterns of use, activities, expectations, satisfaction and demographics. This is an increase of 44 surveys over the 2023 survey. The questions asked during the 2024 survey were the same as the 2023 survey.

The purpose of the survey is to identify:

- Expectations of visitors to the Swan Canning Riverpark;
- Levels of satisfaction with features of the Swan Canning Riverpark;
- · Patterns of recreational use;
- Issues and areas for improvement.
- Trends over time.

Key Findings

- Average satisfaction is 92.3% or 6.46 on a scale of 1 to 7. This is well above the target level of 85% and significantly higher than recent years.
- Overall satisfaction with the Riverpark and its facilities is 100%, above the 2023 median of 97.8% and the highest of the eleven comparative Yardstick surveys.
- Average satisfaction targets were met at 25 out of 25 parks, up from 16 in 2023 and 6 in 2022.
- Cleanliness, security, gardens/trees/landscape features and shade are the four most important features
 of the Riverpark in the locations that were surveyed. The top eight features scored similarly and have
 been consistently at the top for at least the last three years.
- Satisfaction in 2024 was highest with gardens/trees/landscape features, security, river water quality, natural vegetation and paths and tracks. The top eight features are the same as in 2023 and 2022 although in a slightly different order.
- Interpretive signage, toilets and playgrounds scored the lowest for satisfaction in both 2024 and 2023.
- Satisfaction with all features has increased slightly since 2023, and satisfaction with interpretive signage has increased significantly.
- The size of the service gaps for most features are slightly larger than 2023, but none are significant.
- The number of service gaps at individual locations of more than -1.00 has decreased from 2023 and 2022 results with only three significant gaps in 2024 compared with eleven in 2023. Shade is the most commonly identified issue.
- Most respondents (66%) were doing beach and water based activities. The most common water based activities in 2024 are waterskiing/wakeboarding and fishing.

- Only 21% of respondents indicate that they live locally to the site where they were surveyed. This
 compares with 30% in 2023 and 47% in 2022. This may be in part due to focusing on water users for the
 2024 and 2023 surveys.
- A further 77% of respondents come from the wider Perth region, and 2% international visitors compared
 with 65% from the wider region and 5% international in 2023. The number of respondents from the wider
 Perth region has increased slightly over the last four survey periods which again is likely to be related to
 the sampling of water users.
- Most (66%) of respondents use a private vehicle to get to the Riverpark, with 21% of respondents
 walking. For beach and water users, the rate of vehicle use increases to 84% and walking decreases to
 10%. Walking is slightly lower than in 2023 and significantly lower than in 2022, possibly due to the
 increased proportion of respondents being water users and needing to bring equipment. The use of
 public transport and cycles has increased in 2024.
- 60% of respondents spent between 5 and 15 minutes travel time to get to the park they were surveyed at compared with 40% in 2023. A further 19% travelled between 15 and 30 minutes compared with 36% in 2023. Only 13% of respondents travelled for less than 5 minutes, and 8% for more than 30 minutes.
 Compared with 2023 more respondents are travelling for shorter times.
- 44% of respondents visit the site they were surveyed at once a week or more often. This is less than the 54% reported in 2023 and lower than in previous years.
- 75% of respondents were planning to stay for more than an hour in 2024 compared with 74% in 2023 and 55% in 2022. The majority of those staying less than 30 minutes were passing through, cycling or walking. All beach and water users stayed for more than 30 minutes.
- The lower frequency of visitation and the longer planned duration of stay may be related to the sample targeting water users, and the decreased numbers of local users.

Conclusions

- The **average satisfaction** of 92.3% exceeds the target level of 85% average satisfaction in 2024 which is an improvement on previous years.
- The ranking of importance and satisfaction within the thirteen scored features is fairly consistent from year to year.
- Beach and water users are more likely than other users to travel by car and stay for longer than 30 minutes. This is likely to have an impact on demand for parking, toilets and other land-based facilities on parks adjoining the river especially where boat launching is required.
- Provision and quality of shade and toilets are perceived to be inadequate at some locations (see pages 16 to 17 for details) but gaps have decreased since 2023 and earlier years. However, the small individual sample sizes (14 at each park) makes these results less reliable.
- Sampling methodology is likely to affect results such as activities undertaken, modes of transport, visit
 frequency and duration, home location and travel time. There is no clear correlation with satisfaction
 however.

1.0 Methodology

1.1 Project Background

Yardstick Parks User Survey is a survey of park visitors that is carried out annually or as required to meet specific demands for user consultation. The survey is designed to record visitor expectations, satisfaction and behavior.

Visitor expectations of levels of service are measured by asking them to rate the importance of various park features. These results are compared with visitor satisfaction for the same features. Measuring satisfaction gives an indication of performance as measured against expectations. The difference, or gap between importance and satisfaction gives a measure of under or over performance in delivering the expected level of service.

A total of 350 surveys were undertaken from 23 November to 23 December 2024 from 25 different foreshore park and reserve locations along the Swan Canning Riverpark with the main focus on interviewing water users. The Riverpark is not managed by a single authority, so the 25 sites represent river foreshore parks managed by different local and other authorities. The survey repeats the Yardstick surveys undertaken annually from 2017 to 2023. The survey size was increased from 300 to 350 surveys for 2024.

1.2 Questions

The core questions are designed to collect information about the typical core parks facilities and services, and to ensure that the survey can be completed in a typical timeframe of 5 to 8 minutes. Questions are reviewed annually to ensure relevance and to meet current parks management needs.

Custom questions have been added for the Swan Canning Riverpark survey with input from DBCA staff to ensure that the survey meets specific needs. A full set of questions is provided as Appendix One.

In 2021, a seven point Likert scale was introduced to replace the satisfaction scale previously used for overall satisfaction. In 2024 the wording used for this question was "Overall, how satisfied were you with your visit to this park on a scale of 1 to 7, with 1 being the least satisfied and 7 being the most satisfied". This wording was the same as used in 2023.

Other importance and satisfaction responses are scored using the following scoring system:

"Don't know" or blank responses are excluded when calculating both importance and satisfaction. This ensures that these responses do not influence the final results.

1.3 Report features

This report is designed to provide a summary of your specific results for the past year's survey activity and a comparison with results from previous years.

The full results of the survey are available to members online at www.yardstick.global

The on-line report gives results on a park by park basis, as well as the ability to compare your organisation's results against others participating in the project. It includes filter tools to enable members to custom design report results by selecting park types and organisations.

Overall satisfaction percentage is calculated from the total numbers of respondents that gave a score of five, six or seven (i.e. above the mid-point of four) to the specific question on overall satisfaction with the park in which the survey was conducted. Respondents that scored overall satisfaction with their visit to the park as four or less are excluded from the overall satisfaction score. Overall satisfaction is therefore the percentage of satisfied respondents vs not satisfied respondents.

The average (mean) satisfaction is calculated by summing the overall satisfaction scores from all respondents (including those that were not satisfied) and dividing by the total number of responses to give an average score between 1 and 7. This score is converted to a percentage to enable comparison with the target of 85%. Average satisfaction is therefore a score (converted to a percentage) calculated from the scores attributed to each response on the satisfaction scale (see section 1.2). Average satisfaction typically produces a satisfaction score that is lower than overall satisfaction.

Importance and satisfaction for individual features is calculated from the survey questions for those features. The service gap between importance and satisfaction is an indication of under or over performance. Anything less than a full one point +/- result in any chart should be read as a relatively minor indication of a level of service that is too great or too poor.

1.4 Survey Confidence and Reliability

A total of 350 surveys were collected (fourteen per park) and the results aggregated for overall and average satisfaction to provide a confidence level of 95% and a margin of error of 5% for the entire survey.

Standard deviation is used as a measure of the degree to which respondents provided similar or dissimilar responses. Standard deviation is calculated from responses to the question on overall satisfaction for the park. Where the standard deviation of respondents' satisfaction ratings are less than one indicates that most respondents gave similar ratings that were very close to the mean (average) score. The lower the standard deviation, the more consistent the results. The average satisfaction score of 6.46 is higher than in 2023 and the standard deviation is lower.

At each park, sampling focused on people interacting with the Swan and Canning rivers.

2.0 Main Report Comparative Findings

The overall satisfaction of respondents was measured by asking them to rate their overall satisfaction with the park on a scale of 1 to 7 least satisfied to most satisfied. From these scores two measures are calculated, mean satisfaction (average) and overall satisfaction.

2.1 Average satisfaction

The average or mean satisfaction of respondents is calculated by adding the total of all scores (from 1 to 7) and dividing by the total number of respondents. This gives an average or mean score for 2024 of 6.46 or

92.3% across all parks compared with 5.98 or 85.4% in 2023. This represents an increase by nearly half a point or around 8% of the 2023 score.

Chart 1 shows average satisfaction since 2017 with the target satisfaction represented by the yellow line. The target was met in 2017, 2019, 2023 and 2024. Average satisfaction has risen from the low of 80.9% in 2022 to a high of 92.3% at the end of 2024.




Chart 1. Average satisfaction trend

2.2 Overall satisfaction

Overall satisfaction is a measure of the percentage of respondents that were above the midpoint of the scale. Chart 2 shows overall satisfaction since 2017 with a trendline in yellow showing that overall satisfaction has increased slightly during this time. In 2024, all respondents gave a score of 5, 6 or 7 compared with a low in 2021 when around 10% gave a score of 4 or less.




Chart 2. Overall satisfaction trend

Chart 3 shows the performance of Swan Canning Riverpark compared with other Australian organisations that undertook Yardstick parks user surveys recently. Overall satisfaction of Swan Canning Riverpark respondents was scored at 100% which was the highest score of the twelve participating organisations. For comparison purposes, the chart also includes average satisfaction for each organisation alongside overall satisfaction.

The score of 92.3% is an improvement on previous years and is the second highest score behind City of Swan Canning Riverpark. This is a significant improvement on previous years.




Chart 3. Overall satisfaction - Comparison with other organisations

Chart 4 presents the aggregated data for the whole Riverpark showing the distribution of overall satisfaction scores from 1 to 7. The level of satisfaction is higher than 2023, with no respondents scoring at the midpoint or below compared with 1 in 2023, 3 in 2022 and 24 in 2021. No respondents gave a score of one, two, three or four. The majority of respondents gave a score of 6 or 7, with only one scoring 5 resulting in an average score of 6.46.




Chart 4. Distribution of Overall Satisfaction scores

2.3 Satisfaction by park

Chart 5 shows the distribution of overall satisfaction scores for each park. The numbers of responses are shown on each bar.




Chart 5. Overall satisfaction - distribution by park

From the scores as indicated in Chart 5, average satisfaction for each park has been calculated and is shown in Chart 6 for both 2024 and 2023. Average satisfaction varies by park and is higher in 2024 than in 2023. Average satisfaction ranges from 85.7% at Mill Point Reserve and Point Belches to 100% at Bicton Baths and Blackwall Reach. By comparison the lowest average satisfaction in 2023 was 78.6%. All of the 25 parks achieved the target of 85% average satisfaction in 2024 compared with sixteen in 2023. The amount of increase varies between parks with some increasing by as much as 17%.




Chart 6. Average satisfaction score by park

3.0 Key Result areas

3.1 Visitor Expectations

Respondents were asked to rate the importance of a range of parks features on a scale from totally unimportant to very important. This gives a measure of expected level of service for each feature. The standard features that respondents were asked to rate are:

1. Gardens and trees

- 2. Children's playgrounds and equipment (where present)
- 3. Seats and tables
- 4. Toilets
- 5. Signs in the park
- 6. Cleanliness/lack of litter/lack of graffiti
- 7. Grass maintenance
- 8. Paths and tracks/trails
- 9. Shade
- 10. Security (personal safety while in the park)
- 11. Water quality
- 12. Natural vegetation
- 13. Interpretive signage

The mean importance for each feature across all parks is expressed in Chart 7 as a percentage of the maximum possible score. The results for 2023 are included for comparison.




Chart 7. Relative importance of features – all parks

The most important features or services overall are cleanliness, security, gardens/trees/landscape features and shade. The least important feature is playgrounds. The top eight most important features are the same as in 2023 and 2022 although the order is slightly changed. There is no significant difference between the importance of the top seven, and the score is very high. The bottom five features are the same as in 2023, 2022 and 2021. With the exception of grass maintenance, importance scores are slightly higher in 2024 than in 2023.

3.2 Visitor Experiences

Respondents were asked to rate their satisfaction with the same parks features that they had rated for importance. In this case, the scale used was from very dissatisfied to very satisfied. This gives a measure of user experience in terms of whether or not expectations were met.

The mean satisfaction for each feature across all parks is expressed in Chart 8 as a percentage of the maximum possible score. The results for 2023 are included for comparison.

Satisfaction in 2024 was highest with gardens/trees/landscape features, security, river water quality, natural vegetation and paths and tracks. The top eight features are the same as in 2023 and 2022 although in a slightly different order. Interpretive signage, toilets and playgrounds scored the lowest for satisfaction in both 2024 and 2023. Satisfaction with all features has increased slightly since 2023, and satisfaction with interpretive signage has increased significantly.




Chart 8. Relative satisfaction with features – all parks

4.0 Service Gap Analysis

The service gap is calculated by subtracting the importance score from the satisfaction score i.e. experience minus expectations. Where respondents have scored satisfaction lower than importance, this indicates that their experience did not meet their expectations for the feature in the park in which they were surveyed. This is represented by a negative service gap.

On the other hand, if satisfaction scores higher than performance, this results in a positive service gap, indicating a level of over-performance, or a higher level of service being experienced than expected.

Anything less than a full half point (+/-0.5) result in any chart should be read as a relatively minor indication of a level of service that is too great/poor. Anything between +/-0.5 - +/-1.0 should be reviewed and any gap over +/-1.0 requires further examination on why there is a major gap between respondents' expectations and experience.

4.1 Overall Service Gap

Chart 9 shows the difference between importance and satisfaction for all parks. The results from 2023 are included for comparison. The gap varies from –0.49 for shade and +0.53 for playgrounds, and overall are not significant. The positive service gap for playgrounds may indicate that there are no unmet expectations of these features. Service gaps are similar to 2023.

When assessed by park, the service gaps become more significant and can be better targeted for action keeping in mind the sample size of fourteen for each park means that results are indicative with a large margin of error.




Chart 9. Overall service level gap – all parks

4.2 Individual site service gaps

There were a few individual negative service gaps where satisfaction was more than one point less than importance.

The number of service gaps of more than -1.00 has decreased from 2023 and 2022 results with only three significant gaps in 2024 compared with eleven in 2023. Shade is the most commonly identified issue.

Chart 10 shows results for service gaps at individual sites for all features. Highlighted cells show major gaps in service level (red) and minor gaps in service level (yellow). Cells highlighted in green show features where the level of satisfaction is more than 0.5 points higher than importance, indicating that there is no unmet demand for these features at these locations. It should be noted however, that due to the small sample sizes at each site (14 surveys), these results should be considered indicative only.

5.0 Activities Undertaken On Park

5.1 Respondent Activities

Swan Canning Riverpark respondents undertook a range of foreshore land and water related activities, as shown in the charts below. Chart 11 represents the percentage of respondents across all parks who indicated each activity in response to the question "what are you planning to do (or what have you done) in the park today?" People were able to identify more than one activity that they undertook at the park during their visit which is why percentages add to more than 100.

Most respondents were doing beach or water based activities. No respondents were watching sport, and few were running/jogging, watching sport or cycling. The distribution of activities reflects the conscious targeting of respondents that were interacting with the river.




Chart 11. All Parks - Respondents on park activities

The 62% of respondents that indicated they were involved in beach or water-based activities were asked what beach or water based activities they were doing. Chart 12 shows the results. Percentages in the chart are of the respondents that were doing beach or water-based activities.




Chart 12. Beach and water-based activities

Swimming was the most common activity in 2024 followed by fishing, canoeing/kayaking and boating (cruising/recreational). The frequency of activities may have reflected weather conditions and locations at the time of the survey.

5.2 Children's Activities - observed

Children under 15 are not surveyed for ethical reasons. For this reason, researchers log the activity of children in the park whenever they complete a survey so that there is information about the activities of children. Chart 13 represents observed children's activities across all Swan Canning Riverpark parks. Children were present for 75% of surveys. The majority of children were playing with other children or doing beach or water based activities.




Chart 13. Observed Children Activities - All park types

6.0 Supplementary Findings

6.1 Demographic Profile

Under half of respondents (38%) were female and 62% were male. This is not representative of the population of the area and may be a result of the targeting of water users for the survey which were predominantly male.




Chart 14. Gender of respondents

Respondents' age groups are presented in Chart 15. The orange bars show the age distribution of the Greater Perth Region population (15+) from population estimates (to June 2023) based on the 2021 census. The age distribution of the sample population is shown in tan for comparison.

The sample population had significantly fewer respondents over 55, and significantly more in the 35 to 54 age groups compared with the general population of the area.




Chart 15. Age Groups of respondents

6.2 Cultural identity

Respondents were asked their cultural identity and results are shown in Chart 16. The largest cohort identified as Australian, with the next largest cohort being from East or South-east Asia, then Great Britain and Central Asia.




Chart 16. Cultural identity of respondents

6.3 Home Location

As shown in Chart 17, only 21% of respondents identified as local to the park that they were interviewed in with the remaining 77% coming from the wider Perth region and 2% international visitors. Local visitation is lower than in 2023 when it was 30% with 65% coming from the wider region.




Chart 17. Home Location

6.4 Modes of Transport

As shown in Chart 18, around 21% of respondents walked to the park that they were interviewed in. The majority (66%) travelled by private motor vehicle. By comparison, of beach and water users, 84% travelled by private motor vehicle and only 10% walked. The use of public transport and cycles was greater than in 2023.




Chart 18. Modes of Transport to get to park

6.5 Travel time

All respondents were asked how long they had travelled to get to the park. Responses are shown in Chart 19. Around 60% of respondents spent between 5 and 15 minutes travel time to get to the park they were surveyed at compared with 40% in 2023. A further 19% travelled between 15 and 30 minutes compared with 36% in 2023. Only 13% of respondents travelled for less than 5 minutes, and 8% for more than 30 minutes. Compared with 2023 more respondents are travelling for shorter times.




Chart 19. Travel times

6.6 Walking times

Respondents that indicated they lived locally (74 respondents) were asked how long it would take to walk home from the park where they were interviewed. Just over half (54%) of respondents lived up to 10 minutes' walk away from the park they were interviewed at, with only 3% living more than 30 minutes' walk away. Compared with 2023 results more local respondents lived within 5 minutes of the park. Results are shown in Chart 20.




Chart 20. Walking times - Local respondents from all parks

As shown in Chart 21, the 56 respondents that actually walked to the park where they were interviewed (see Chart 18 for modes of transport) gave a similar result except that there were no local walkers that lived more than 20 minutes walk from the park. There was a high correlation between respondents that were local to the park and walking as a mode of transport i.e. 76% of local respondents walked to the park where they were interviewed.




Chart 21. Walking times – Local respondents that walked

6.7 Visitor Frequency

Overall, around 44% of respondents visited the park at least once a week, and around 67% visited at least once a month. Visitation rates are slightly down on 2023 and this may be related to the lower proportion of local visitors sampled. Only 2% were visiting for the first time compared with 5% in 2023.




Chart 22. Visitor Frequency

6.8 Visit Duration

Chart 23 shows the duration of respondents' visits to the park that they were interviewed in. Visitors were most likely to spend between one and two hours at the park. Only 5% of respondents stayed less than 30 minutes and 24% planned spend two to four hours visiting the park. The majority of those staying less than 30 minutes were passing through, cycling or walking. All beach and water users stayed for more than 30 minutes.

The duration of visit was very similar to 2023 and slightly longer than in 2022 and previous years.




Chart 23. Duration of Visit

7.0 Respondent Feedback

Visitors to the Swan Canning Riverpark parks were asked what change they would suggest to the park they were visiting. In some cases respondents did not have a suggestion. They were also asked what they enjoyed most about their visit. Full results are given in Appendix Two along with demographic data and overall satisfaction.

The feedback was analyzed by AI and the following key themes identified:

8.1 Enjoyment

In general, the most common themes for enjoyment of the Riverpark were:

1. Water Activities

- Swimming, kayaking, paddleboarding, and kitesurfing are highly popular.
- Boating and jet skiing frequently enjoyed, often combined with family time.
- Fishing was mentioned as a favorite pastime, both alone and with friends or family.

2. Family and Community Time

- Family picnics, BBQs, and spending time with loved ones were frequently mentioned.
- Parents particularly enjoyed taking children to the playground or for swimming.
- Events like Christmas parties and community gatherings were appreciated.

3. Relaxation and Scenic Views

- Many enjoyed simply relaxing, sitting, or walking by the river, often admiring the views.
- The calm and natural surroundings of the parks were highlighted as a major draw.

4. Outdoor Sports and Fitness

- Running, cycling, trail walking, and other fitness activities were often mentioned.
- Cricket, volleyball, and playing at the BMX track added to the variety of activities.

5. Dog Walking

 Parks were often used for dog walking, with many enjoying the opportunity for off-leash areas and the chance to interact with others.

6. Nature and Wildlife

- Bird watching and experiencing the natural flora and fauna were significant attractions.
- Visitors appreciated how clean, well-maintained, and natural the parks felt.

7. Socializing

Catching up with friends and enjoying the community atmosphere were key highlights.

8. Facilities

Many praised the cleanliness, shade, and amenities like playgrounds, BBQ areas, and cafes.

8.2 Comments by location

Banks Reserve:

- Most enjoyed activity: Fishing and relaxing with friends and family.
- Suggested improvement: More shade, improved river access, and additional seating.
- Condition of river foreshore: Generally clean, well-maintained, and healthy.

Belmont Water Ski Area:

- Most enjoyed activity: Cycling, boating, and water skiing.
- Suggested improvement: More shade, updated bins, and heritage inclusion.
- Condition of river foreshore: Natural, well-used, and healthy, though some areas could benefit from cleanup.

Bicton Baths and Blackwall Reach:

- Most enjoyed activity: Swimming, sunbathing, and family activities.
- Suggested improvement: Better car parking, more BBQs, and community events.
- Condition of river foreshore: Scenic, safe, and well-maintained.

Burswood Park:

- Most enjoyed activity: Walking, cycling, and family picnics.
- Suggested improvement: Improved water access, better security, and disability-friendly parking.
- Condition of river foreshore: Natural, healthy, and shaded.

Claisebrook Cove:

- Most enjoyed activity: Boating, fishing, and enjoying views.
- Suggested improvement: Toilets closer to amenities, more shade, and better playground facilities.
- Condition of river foreshore: Clean, healthy, and scenic, though minor algae and debris issues exist.

Deep Water Point:

- Most enjoyed activity: Paddle boarding, swimming, and walking.
- Suggested improvement: More seating, safer parking, and improved lighting.
- Condition of river foreshore: Well-maintained, busy, and healthy.

Fish Market Reserve:

- Most enjoyed activity: Kayaking, boating, and fishing.
- Suggested improvement: Public toilets, shade, and better boat ramp facilities.

Condition of river foreshore: Natural and healthy, though some debris needs cleanup.

Garvey Park:

- Most enjoyed activity: Kayaking, exercising, and enjoying natural features.
- Suggested improvement: More shade, larger facilities, and litter management.
- Condition of river foreshore: Natural, scenic, and well-used, with occasional rubbish.

JH Abrahams Reserve:

- Most enjoyed activity: Kitesurfing and walking through the park.
- Suggested improvement: Additional hoses for washing, better seating, and more bins.
- Condition of river foreshore: Healthy, natural, and well-maintained, with minor issues such as odors or worn grass.

Jon Tonkin Reserve, Preston Point, East Fremantle

- Most Enjoyed Activity: Walking, enjoying the riverfront, and boating activities were popular. Many enjoy dog walking, playgrounds, and views of the river.
- Suggested Improvements: Common suggestions included more seating and shade, playground upgrades, and better facilities for boaters (ramps, parking, and seating).
- Condition of River Foreshore: Generally described as natural, healthy, and pleasant, though some noted areas affected by cars and boats.

Keanes Point, The Esplanade

- Most Enjoyed Activity: Fishing, family outings, kayaking, and picnics were highly enjoyed activities.
- Suggested Improvements: Requests for more seating, drink fountains, shade, and minor upgrades to playgrounds or facilities.
- Condition of River Foreshore: Described as well-maintained, natural, picturesque, and clean, with some suggestions for historical signage or addressing occasional litter.

- Most Enjoyed Activity: Kayaking, family outings, and relaxation were common. The BMX track and Christmas parties were also popular.
- Suggested Improvements: More shade, parking, seating, and facilities near the river. Improvements to the BMX track and clearer paths for cyclists/walkers were also mentioned.
- Condition of River Foreshore: Generally positive feedback, with mentions of healthy vegetation, cleanliness, and good water quality.

Lilac Hill

- Most Enjoyed Activity: Cricket and family picnics dominated the responses. Fishing and walking around the area were also popular.
- Suggested Improvements: More shade and seating for cricket games and improved facilities (e.g., drink fountains).
- Condition of River Foreshore: Generally well-regarded but less frequently used compared to other parks. Some suggestions for more shade along the river.

Matilda Bay Reserve

- Most Enjoyed Activity: Relaxing by the river, swimming, walking, and attending functions were highly appreciated.
- Suggested Improvements: Requests for additional seating, better car parking, and upgrades to toilets and launching facilities.
- Condition of River Foreshore: Widely praised as beautiful, natural, and accessible, with ample sitting
