

For Parks and Wildlife Approved Mooring Contractor Companies

The following procedures apply to Mooring Contractor Companies approved by Parks and Wildlife.

An approved company satisfies Parks and Wildlife's requirements in terms of adequate insurance cover and experience with mooring installation and maintenance.

If your company is interested in applying to become a Parks and Wildlife Approved Mooring Contractor, please provide the information listed in the boxes below.

- 1. Under the Conservation and Land Management Regulations 2002 a person cannot install or use a mooring without authorisation from Parks and Wildlife. As a mooring contractor you may **not** install a mooring in a marine park, marine nature reserve or marine management area unless an authority from Parks and Wildlife has been issued (please ensure you obtain a copy of this authority from the person contracting your services, or apply for it yourself). After a mooring has been installed, Parks and Wildlife will only authorise a person to use the mooring when the mooring inspection report has been received and assessed by Parks and Wildlife.
- 2. If you have been contracted to install or inspect a mooring within Parks and Wildlife's managed waters please give a courtesy call to the local Parks and Wildlife Marine Park Co-ordinator to advise when you intend to carry out the services and that you are an approved mooring contractor with Parks and Wildlife. This will help ensure a smooth operation on the day, if the department is aware of who you are and what services you are undertaking within the marine park.
- 3. Please be aware that contractors approved by Parks and Wildlife are required to provide updated insurance certificates on an ongoing basis.

To apply to become a Parks and Wildlife Approved Mooring Contractor, please supply:

- a brief summary of the company's qualifications and experience in installing, maintaining and inspecting moorings (written references may be requested);
- a copy of the insurer's certificate of insurance clearly showing current insurance cover and amounts for General, Professional and Third Party Liability Insurance cover, with Third Party Public Liability Insurance coverage to conduct mooring inspections of at least A\$10 million.
- survey details of the vessel/s to be used in operations.
